1.4 Getting Started

1.4.1 Peel off the screen protector

Before you peel off the screen protector, please note that there are two layers of the screen protector. Kindly pull on the white tab and remove the top layer of screen protector. Keep the second layer on the screen.



WARNING! Please DO NOT kink, shake or bend the cable. It may cause damage.


1.4.2 Turning the device on and off

Turn on the device: firmly press and hold the bottom right **[**Power Button **]** until the boot screen appears.

Turn off the device: firmly press and hold the **[**Power Button **]** to display the options menu. Select the **Power off** option to shut down.

Sleep mode: with the device turned on, press the **[**Power Button**]** to turn off the screen and go into sleep mode.

Wake and unlock the device: Press the [Power Button] to wake the device in the sleep mode, and swipe upwards to unlock the screen.




Note: If the device has been idle for a period of time, the screen will automatically go into sleep mode.

1.4.3 Insert Micro SD / Nano SIM card


- 1. Power off the device before inserting or removing the Micro SD card or the Nano SIM card.
- 2. Flip the device to its rear side.
- 3. Push the battery cover locks A and B upward to the open position (according to FIG. 1).
- 4. Detach the battery cover.
- 5. Insert the Micro SD card and SIM card according to the battery compartment (according to FIG. 2):
 - Face the Micro SD card metal contacts downwards and push into the slot.
 - Face the SIM card metal contacts downwards and push into the slot.

Note: When the battery is in, please remove the battery first following the instructions in the **1.4.5 Remove the Battery** before you insert or remove the Micro SD card or the Nano SIM card.






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1.4.4 Install the Battery

- 1. Flip the device to its rear side.
- 2. Push the battery cover locks A and B upward to the open position (according to FIG. 1).
- 3. Detach the battery cover.
- 4. Push the battery lock to the left (open position).
- 5. Insert the Battery: Align the contacts of the battery with the terminals of the battery compartment, and put in the battery gently. (①)
- 6. Push the battery lock to the right (close position). (2)
- 7. Attach the battery cover. (③)
- 8. Push the back cover locks A and B downward to the close position to secure the battery cover. (④)





- 5. Remove the battery. (③)



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1.4.6 Charging the Battery

Connect the cable and the device with USB type-c interface, and plug in the other end with adapter.

During normal charging, the home screen status bar will display the charging icon when screen is on. When the charging is completed, the home screen status bar will display the full battery icon when screen is on.
